Dear Mr. McElfresh:

Medical training conducted by Tactical Medics International (TMI) was evaluated by a Department of Defense (DOD) medical officer and veterinarian. This letter serves to inform you that a July 2007 final review of these evaluations found TMI currently meets our requirements for attendance by special operations forces (SOF) personnel. Per command policy, TMI will be reassessed for continued acceptability at an interval of not more than two years. As such, inspection may recur at any time, but no later than July 2009. Of particular importance is strict adherence to federal and DOD animal and human use regulations and law.

TMI is admonished that commercial training attended by SOF members has certain prohibitions and requirements beyond those proscribed by federal government regulation and law. Such command policy and/or DOD regulatory prohibitions and requirements are found in the enclosure which is excerpted from the United States Special Operations Command (USSOCOM) directive covering medical training. Any subsequent inspection or other evidence that finds TMI is no longer in compliance with command policy and requirements will result in the immediate suspension of approval and subsequent attendance by SOF personnel.

A copy of this letter will be forwarded to the Command Staff Judge Advocate. TMI's compliance with command requirements for attendance by SOF personnel does not in any way constitute or imply endorsement by USSOCOM, the Department of Defense or the United States Government, of any information, products or services offered by TMI.
